Ambassador Mary Ann Peters is a Professor of Practice at the Andrew Young School of Public Policy, Georgia State University. She recently retired from her position as CEO of The Carter Center. As CEO, Mary provided vision and leadership for The Carter Center and oversaw program implementation and operations. The Carter Center is a global not-for-profit institution founded in 1982 by former President Jimmy Carter and Mrs. Carter to advance human rights and alleviate suffering among the world's poorest people. The Center has a global workforce of more than 1200

people and FY 14 revenue and support of approximately \$270 million. From September 2008 to 2014, Mary served as Provost of the U.S. Naval War College, a professional military education institution accredited to grant a master's degree in national security and strategic studies. Mary spent more than 30 years as a career diplomat with the U.S. Department of State.
